


Clayton County Board of Commissioners serve staggered terms of four years and are elected by district. Electorate chooses full-time chairman.

- Frank Bailey Senior Center, J. Charley Griswell Senior Center and Kinship Intergenerational Center became the only nationally accredited senior centers in the state of Georgia under the National Council of Aging's Institute of Senior Centers.
- J. Charley Griswell Senior Center received a National Program of Excellence Award for their Open Mic and Poetry Slam.
- Senior Services partnered with Georgia State University to provide suicide prevention training to our staff. Recent studies are showing the suicide rate is increasing

amongst the senior population, specifically homebound seniors. Over 80% of our Aging program staff and senior center staff were trained in the world's leading suicide intervention training program, ASIST (Applied Suicide Intervention Training).

We are looking forward to an even more exciting 2020 as we continue to provide all of the quality programs and services that our senior population has grown to love and expect. We will continue to provide innovative and creative programs to keep seniors, relative caregivers and our homebound clients independent, engaged, active and healthy.
